Full-time Status	Undergraduate Students: 12-18 credits (4-6 classes)	
Course Approval	Course requests will be reviewed by the appropriate academic dean within St.	
	John's University and approved based on pre-requisite requirements and	
	availability.	
Course Registration	Initial course registration will be completed by the Office of Global Studies	
	prior to the student's arrival. Every attempt will be made to enroll students in	
	their requested courses, pending dean's approval and course availability. If	
	courses are unavailable, replacement courses will be chosen and students will be notified.	
Language Requirements	Minimum TOEFL score for admission (IBT): 61	
Language Requirements	Winnindin TOETE score for admission (IDT). Of	
	Students scoring in the range of 61-80 on the TOEFL IBT will be required to	
	take an ESL Placement Test upon arrival for all undergraduate colleges other	
	than The Peter J. Tobin College of Business. Tobin students scoring 80 or	
	above may also be required to take the ESL placement test.

Housing Fees	Students applying for St. John's housing are charged the appropriate housing
	and meal-plan fees.
Additional Fees	Certain classes may require additional lab fees, usually \$100 per class.
	Students who take an ESL course or another language course, e.g., Spanish are
	charged a \$50 language fee, which covers access to tutoring through the
	Global Language and Cultural Center.
Visa Requirements	
Type of Visa Required	All non-U.S. citizens applying for an exchange must obtain a J-1 visa prior to
	their arrival in the U.S. Each student should complete a DS-2019 Application
	(included in the application packet) and submit it with their Exchange
	Application. The St. John's International Student and Scholar Services Office
	(ISSSO) will process all DS-2019 requests and send additional paperwork to
	the students following acceptance.
Conditions of visa status	In order to maintain J-1 visa status, all students must check in with the ISSSO
	upon arrival, be enrolled in at least 12 St. John's credits per semester, attend
	classes regularly during the semester, and have sufficient health insurance.
